Tāmaki Makaurau regularly travels overseas connecting with other indigenous cultures to share and discuss the current challenges we as indigenous people are faced with.

A recent highlight for our roopu has been the introduction of Walking Basketball at our Haka 2 Hoops 3x3 Tournament. It was fabulous to see kuia in the 60y to 70y age bracket being active. Ka Mau te Wehi!
